GENERAL PURPOSE COMMITTEE - INFRASTRUCTURE

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ITEM: 46 **Un-named Quarter Sessions Road, Colo - Naming Proposal**

FILE NUMBER: GR120/003 PT03/ENG/INI25NBX.E01

REPORT:

Representations have been received seeking naming of a presently un-named Quarter Sessions road situated approximately 1.4 kms north of Colo River Bridge as “Whatley’s Creek Road”.

The section of this road for which Council is the road authority extends from Putty Road to the southern boundary of Lot 30, DP 83506 and is bounded by Lots 1, 2 and 3 DP 881241; the balance of road north of this point appears to be Crown road.

Reasons given for naming of the road include:

1. In honour of Charles Whatley who owned extensive land parcels in the locality in the early 1800's.
2. The road parallels Whatley’s Creek.
3. Formalisation of mailing address for properties fronting the Quarter Sessions road.

Guidelines issued by the Geographical Names Board preclude use of double barrelled names and names bearing an apostrophe. Accordingly, it is proposed that this road be named “Whatley Road”.

The Hawkesbury Historical Society has advised support of the proposed name.

RECOMMENDATION:

That public comment be sought regarding naming of the un-named Quarter Sessions road approximately 1.4 kms north of Colo River Bridge and extending from Putty Road to the southern boundary of Lot 30, DP 83506, as Whatley Road.

The NSW Department of Sport and Recreation have completed the eligibility assessment of all projects submitted under the 2001/2002 Capital Assistance Program.

Five applications were received for the 2001/2002 Capital Assistance Program from the Hawkesbury LGA. Assessment of these projects was undertaken by the prioritising committee on Wednesday 5 September in order to be returned to the NSW Department of Sport and Recreation for Wednesday 12 September.

ITEM: 48 **Truck Parking Bay, North Wilberforce - Toilet Block**

REPORT:

Council has been advised on numerous occasions of vandalism, in varying degrees of severity, occurring to the amenities block at the truck parking bay located at North Wilberforce. The last incident at this location rendered the facility unusable and in a dangerous state.

Whilst the building was insured and it would be possible to claim on the insurance and have the facility rebuilt, Council would be required to pay \$2,500 excess on that claim. It is felt, however, that due to the severity and ongoing nature of the vandalism to the building, including the fact that it is unusable for the majority of the time, consideration should be given to the removal of the facility from this location.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the amenities block at the truck parking bay at North Wilberforce be demolished and not rebuilt at this stage.
